## DAILY ITINERARY



*New basilica dedicated to  
St John Paul II*

### **Day 1, Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> October UK/ Krakow**

Fly from London Gatwick direct to Krakow. Upon arrival transfer to our hotel by coach for evening dinner.

### **Day 2, Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October Krakow/Wieliczka/ Salt Mine**

Breakfast at the hotel followed by Mass at the Sanctuary and afterwards we journey by coach to visit the Wieliczka Salt Mine (a UNESCO world heritage site). There we will travel underground for approximately 2km to the oldest part of the mine and visit its subterranean museum. This mine has been worked for 700 years until the present day. We return to the Sanctuary and join the nuns at 3pm to say the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, after which we will participate in the Mass for the pilgrims at the Basilica. After Mass we will meet with the nuns who will give a talk to the group about the life of St Faustina. Dinner at the hotel.

### **Day 3, Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October Wawel Cathedral/St Mary's Basilica**

After breakfast, coach transfer to Wawel Castle and walk through the ground onto the Cathedral. Sightseeing tour of this magnificent cathedral including the chapel where St John Paul II celebrated his first Mass. We also visit Sigismund Chapel, a masterpiece of Renaissance art and architecture. The tombs of many of Poland's kings and queens and their greatest national heroes are located here. Afterwards walk to St Mary's Square (Market Square) one of the largest and oldest squares in Europe where we will have a guided tour of St Mary's Basilica - one of the finest Gothic structures in the country. Note: if you wish to take pictures inside the basilica there is a charge of 5 euros. We will have lunch in the square; there are many cafés and restaurants to choose from. If time permits we can have a look at the covered market where you may purchase local produce such as jewellery, bags and hand painted ornaments. Return to the hotel for dinner.

### **Day 4, Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> October Wadowice/Kalwaria**

After breakfast we drive to Wadowice, the home town of St John Paul II. We visit the Holy Father's House, now a museum, and the parish church where he was baptised. It is considered one of the most beautiful churches in Poland. We will celebrate Mass here followed by a guided tour of this historic site. We stop at Kalwaria

Zebrzydowska - Poland's first Calvary sanctuary, established in 1600. St John Paul II visited here with his father as a boy and often during his priestly life. On his first pilgrimage to Poland in 1979, he said, "I would like you to pray for me here, both during my life and after it." You will also see some of his personal belongings here. We return to our hotel for dinner.

### **Day 5, Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October Auschwitz**

Today we visit Auschwitz Birkenau visiting the former concentration camp which was the scene of terrible human suffering during the Second World War. We see the cell of St Maximilian Kolbe where he died giving up his life to save another. (Auschwitz is not suitable for visitors under 15 years of age). Return to the hotel for dinner.



### **Day 6, Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> October Free day - not a guided visit**

After breakfast, we walk up to the new vast and modern basilica dedicated to St John Paul II and look around. Afterwards, we will do stations of the Cross at the Sanctuary followed by lunch. At 3pm we join the Nuns for prayer at St Faustina's chapel. Free time for the rest of today.



Mass will be arranged. Dinner at the hotel.

### **Day 7, Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> October Czestochowa/Krakow**

After breakfast we depart for Czestochowa - Home of the Miraculous Icon of Our Lady known as the Black Madonna - the Queen of Poland. This is the Holiest place in Poland and is the third largest Catholic pilgrimage site in the world. We also visit the museum where the impressive treasures and sacred liturgy garments used by Popes and Kings. Afterwards we tour the beautiful basilica of the Holy Cross and the Nativity of Mary with its magnificent Baroque altar depicting the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven. Return to our hotel and dinner here.

### **Day 8, Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> October Krakow/UK**

Depending on the time of our flight departure, we may celebrate Mass in one of the Chapels in St Faustina's Shrine. Proceed to the airport for our flight back to London.
